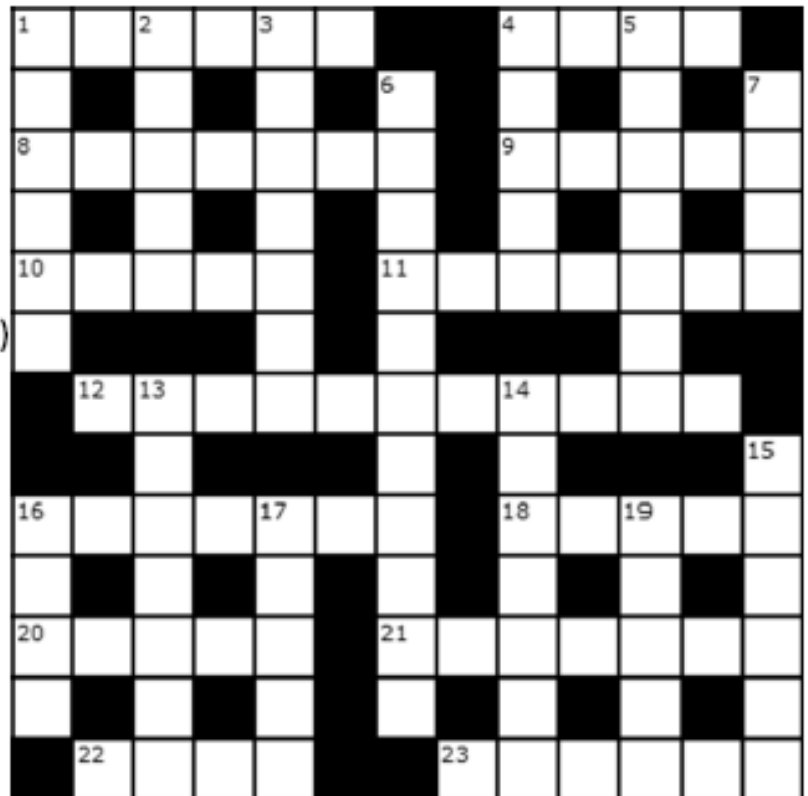

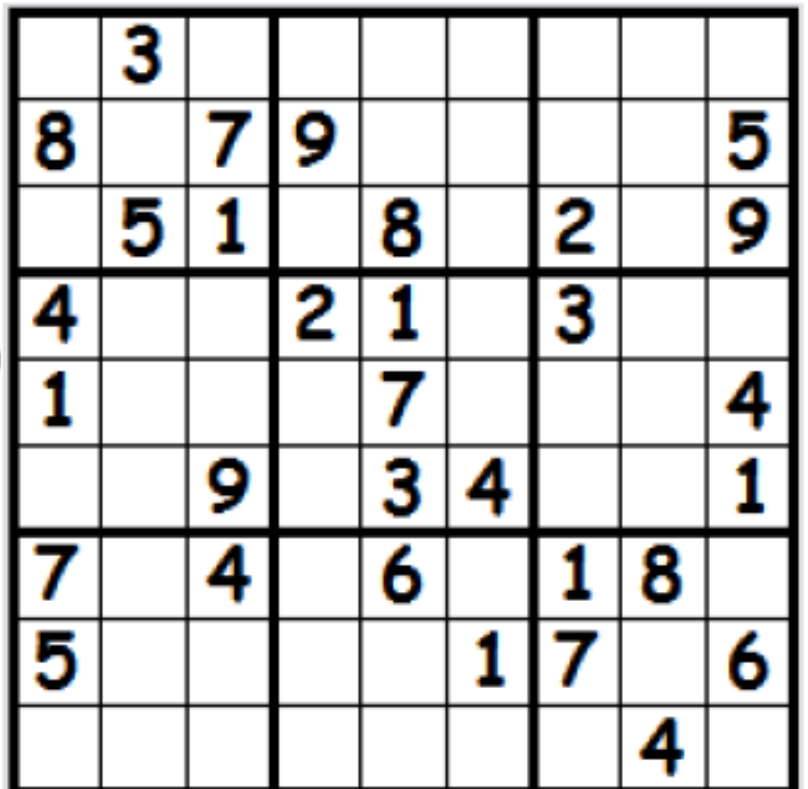

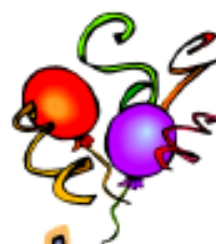

## W OOTTON PARISH COUNCIL UPDATE

After its December break, the parish council met again in January with a busy agenda.

First of all we welcomed our new Parish Clerk, Corina Cheeks, to her first meeting. It is Corina's first job as a parish clerk but she's already started her professional training and with Cris Hoad's help as a mentor, she will soon be up to speed and able to handle all the complex tasks

that the job involves. Her email remains the same as before (clerkwpc0@gmail.com) if you need to contact her.

Our county councillor, Andy Graham, updated us on a range of issues including the new parking scheme for Woodstock which is being introduced in a few months time. He reassured the meeting that though on-street parking charges will be introduced, parking for less than one hour will still be free. It is hoped that the new arrangements will put an end to all day parking in the centre of the town and thus free up space for short term shopping visits.

There was an update on the Botley West solar farm developments where more detailed information about the process and timetable will be published soon by the District Council.

Finally we had an informative presentation by the outgoing head of Wootton school about the current teaching arrangements which now involve all the children being taken over to Tackley school. Wraparound care is still available at Wootton for those children whose parents prefer it to be here rather than at Tackley. The new arrangements seem to be working well. We were also able to welcome the new head, Mrs Karen Ward. But clearly the current arrangements cannot continue for

the longer term and Gordon Joiner from ODST set out the challenges facing the trust as the responsible body for providing the school. We appreciated his honesty in explaining that with the number of pupils now in the school and those forecast for next year, the possibility of closure was very real. The guiding principle which they wanted to observe was that whatever decisions needed to be made should be in the best interests of the children and their education. # WOOTTON VILLAGE HALL TALKS

Our next speaker at 7.30pm on Friday February 10th is JACK STRAW, who served in the Cabinet from 1997 to 2010 under Labour governments and held two of the great offices of state - Home Secretary and later Foreign Secretary from 2001. It was during this time that he dealt with Iran - and this is at the heart of his book, *The English Job*, which has won widespread acclaim and will be the subject of his talk in Wootton. His appearance is timely as Iran is very much in the news with widespread protests - and the execution of several opposition activists. In 2001, Jack Straw became the first British Foreign Secretary to visit Iran since the 1979 revolution and has developed a deep interest in the country ever since. Along with French and German counterparts, he initiated the "E3" nuclear negotiations, which led to the nuclear deal with Iran in 2015. During one trip in that year, he was handed a document effectively blaming him for more than a century and a half of malign British interference in Iran's politics. In his talk, he will examine Britain's extraordinary and tangled

relationship with Iran - and why so many Iranians are obsessed with Britain's role in their history. Among British diplomats, there's a rather poignant joke that "Iran is the only country in the world which still regards the United Kingdom as a superpower" - but for many Iranians, it's not a joke at all. Scratch the surface and Iranians of all political persuasions will remind people that it was Britain, along with the US, which removed the democratically elected Prime Minister of Iran, Mohammad Mossadegh. The coup against Mossadegh may have been in 1953, but for Iranians that feels like yesterday.

As many Britons continue to define themselves by what happened eighty years ago at the start of the Second World War, modern Iranians define themselves by their bloody experience of the Iran-Iraq War of 1980-88, when the country stood alone against an act of unprovoked aggression by Saddam Hussein. The rest of the world - France, the Soviet Union and, later, the US and the UK - all piled in to support Iraq, with Saudi Arabia and other Gulf states bankrolling Saddam.
