FROM THE
RECTORY



For most of my ministry work with schools and young families has been a central feature. Back in the Ironstone benefice this meant weekly assemblies at one church school, monthly ones at another, and then also being on both governing bodies. This next week in July sees the end of term for many schools but also a significant moment for Wootton school. On Saturday 15th many of us attended what was both a celebration of education in this particular school building but also a farewell as that particular era has now come to an end. This is a sad moment as we know from experience that losing a village school is a one-way ticket. As I have not been part of this process it is difficult for me to comment but my task is to help the village and

those families that are involved to move forward. I have now spent a morning at Tackley School and will be part of the Local Governing Body as well as taking occasional assemblies. I would hope that there will be other ways of getting to know the families in the parish and perhaps finding new ways of engaging church with younger members of our communities. Having only been in post for 7 weeks it is still early days to be able to see a clear way forward, but what I do know from experience is that this can best emerge from a team effort. It will all depend on what others have the will and interest to generate in terms of collective activity. As one school year draws to a close we need to look forward to the next one and to discover how our hopes and plans for a different sort of engagement will play out.

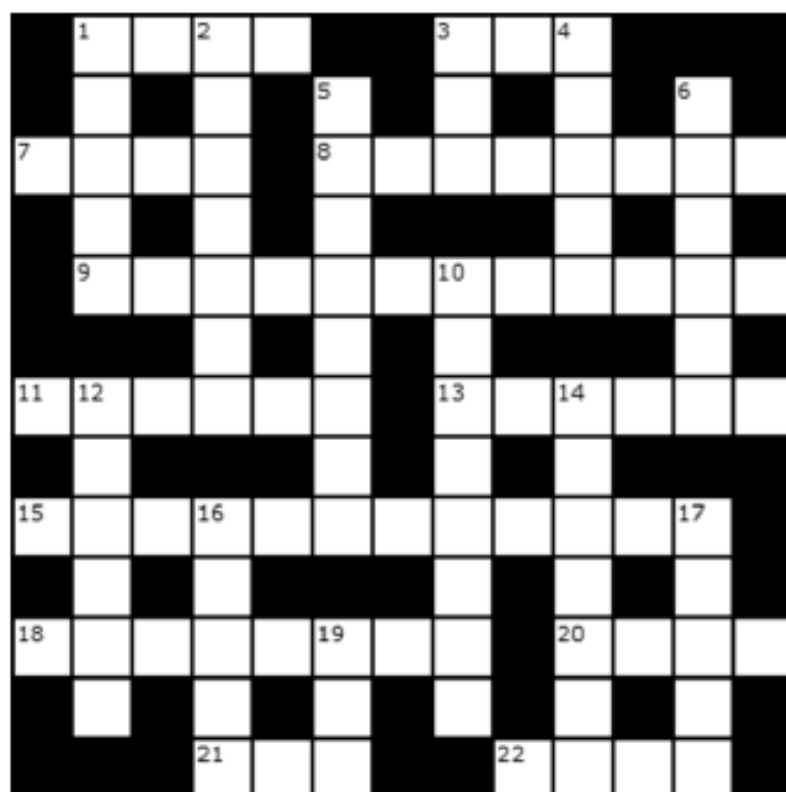

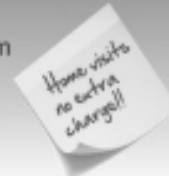

Wootton Relief in Need is an important village charity which provides financial help to local people who are in distress or facing hardship. The Parish Council is responsible for appointing some of the trustees of the charity and over the next couple of months we need to make two appointments. One is for a vacancy which has just arisen with the resignation of Mrs Ann Day, and the term of office of another trustee will end in the autumn. Trustees make the decisions about how the charity works and enable it to carry out its mission. The role does not involve fundraising, and doesn't need any specialist skills, or previous experience as a trustee. But you do need to be over 18. Empathy and understanding, together with local knowledge, and a concern for the welfare of others are the main attributes which we are looking for. Previous experience working with those in need and knowledge of the benefit system would be useful. Trustees are not paid. WOOTTON VILLAGE HALL TALKS

Our next speaker on Friday September 15th is MENSUN BOUND, the world-renowned marine archaeologist, known as "The Indiana Jones of the Deep" and recently back from a speaking-tour across the United States. Mensun was director of exploration for two expeditions to the Weddell Sea which led to the rediscovery of the Endurance, in which Sir Ernest Shackleton and a crew of 27 men sailed for the Antarctic on the 1914–1917 Imperial Trans-Antarctic Expedition.

He is also renowned for directing the excavation of an Etruscan 6th Century BC shipwreck off Giglio Island, in Italy, the oldest known shipwreck of the Archaic era. Fine wares from the site consisted mainly of Corinthian, Laconian, Ionian and Etruscan fabrics representing a range of shapes. Some were painted with human figures, animals, florals and mythological motifs.
